The Cubs had another busy program with four camps in the year plus many other activities. The May camp at Fryland Woods included navigation, archery, athletics, assault course and the tunnels. At the Sixers and Seconders camp at Jordan Heights, the Cubs put up their own tents, learnt to climb on a rock face and cooked their own meals. The Cubs presented "100 years of Cubs: then and now" at the AGM. We held a joint activity evening with the 2nd Reigate (Earlswood) Cubs, visited Pets at Home and went pond dipping in Reigate Priory Pond. We took part in the District Football competition. The other main activity of the summer was the District Cub Scout visit to Duxford Air Museum as part of the 100 year celebration.

Autumn started with an introduction to Geocaching followed by the Cub and Parent camp at Polyapes. We reached a number of the finals in the District Go-Karts. We ran a game looking at 3rd World farming before Harvest Festival. The Cubs completed the artist badge by doing a number of different projects. We had a joint night with the Beavers. This term also included singing carols at a sheltered accommodation in Horley and an evening at Lazer World. As 2016 was the Celebration of 100 years of Cubs we ended with a District activity based afternoon.

2017 began with an evening looking at being a hero and helping other people and fire safety, followed by evenings on exploring the Chinese New Year, learning about St David, home safety and healthy eating. At our Space themed indoor camp at Pease Pottage, 18 cubs learnt more about stars (completing their astronomy badge) and survival. The Cubs were winners of both the District Swimming Gala and District Cooking Competition.

10 Cubs achieved the Chief Scout Silver award during the year.
