The cubs took part in the Redhill Sizzler with a gun run before the sixers and seconders travelled to Nutfield for our own Sixer's camp where they pitched their own tent, planned and completed a hike, cooked their own meals and learnt pioneering. The summer finished with canoeing and our water games.

Autumn started with the very wet but competitive cub and parent camp at Ranmore Common with a Dad Army theme.
